To Whom It May Concern,

Sara Tanney's mental health has been evaluated and reviewed. I am familiar with the patient's symptomology, history, and limitations imposed by their disability.

Sara Tanney has been diagnosed with a condition recognized in the DSM-5 that involves symptoms of anxiety. This diagnosis substantially limits one or more of my patient's major life activities. This diagnosis meets the definition of disability under the Americans with Disabilities Act, the Fair Housing Act, and the Rehabilitation act of 1973 §504.

In order to reduce the possibility of decompensation associated with the disability, or to reduce the impairment associated with this diagnosis disability and flying, I am in support of a psychiatric service dog to accompany Sara Tanney on all flights as well as lodging and workplace accommodations.

This letter meets the legal requirements under the (Title VIII of the Civil Rights Act of 1968)), Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, Pub. L. No. 93-112, 87 Stat. 394 (Sept. 26, 1973), codified at 29 U.S.C. 5 701 et seq.), the Americans with Disabilities Act (Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, Pub. L. No. 101-336, 104 Stat. 328 (1990) and The Department of Transportation (DOT) 14 CFR Part 382 "final order" (12/02/2020)

This assessment and accommodations are valid for one year from the date of issuance.
